
To renew by mail, please cut out or copy the form below, fill out the requested information, and mail to TRA with your check.

## **Space Development Agency Aims High for 2024 After Strong 2023 Start**

The Space Development Agency (SDA) has set its sights on an ambitious launch schedule for 2024 following two successful launches this year that marked steady progress for the fledgling U.S. Space Force agency. "Starting next September, it's an 11-launch campaign over 11 months, one launch a month," SDA Director Derek Tournear said at a National Security Space Association online forum.

SDA is developing a network of satellites known as the Proliferated Warfighter Space Architecture — a large constellation of lower-cost, mass-produced satellites in low Earth orbit. This is different from the traditional DoD approach of using small numbers of expensive, highly-customized satellites. The constellation is designed to provide capabilities like advanced missile warning, tracking and targeting of hypersonic weapons, space asset defense, and battlefield awareness and targeting.

In 2024, SDA expects to initiate launches for the first operational satellites that will comprise Tranche 1 of the proliferated low-Earth-orbit architecture. The goal is to get 161 satellites into orbit in less than a year, Tournear said.

These include 126 Tranche 1 Transport Layer communications satellites made by York Space Systems, Lockheed Martin and Northrop Grumman; and 35 missile-tracking sensor satellites made by L3Harris, Northrop Grumman and RTX.

Tournear said he has been impressed seeing new space companies like York Space Systems maturing rapidly, while established defense giants like Lockheed Martin and Northrop Grumman are upping their game by partnering with commercial suppliers.

Tournear said at one point he feared that Lockheed Martin and Northrop Grumman, both established aerospace and defense


companies, "would operate under their big classical aerospace and defense mentality on these programs. We've actually seen the opposite." To get prices down and accelerate production, these companies teamed with commercial vendors. Northrop Grumman is not building buses but buying them from Airbus' OneWeb production line. "And what we're seeing is that the bigs are not acting like they do on large cost-plus contracts," Tournear added. "We've got them on fixed-price contracts, they're relying a lot on their new space partners to be able to provide the speed and the efficiency so that they can hit our price points."

## Northrop Grumman Announces New \$2.5 Billion Share Repurchase Authorization

Northrop Grumman announced that its board of directors has authorized an additional \$2.5 billion for the repurchase of the company's common stock, increasing the outstanding authorized amount to approximately \$3.8 billion. Share repurchases will take place from time to time, subject to market conditions and management's discretion, in the open market or in privately negotiated transactions.



# Northrop Grumman Completes Critical Design Review for the Space Development Agency

Northrop Grumman recently completed its Critical Design Review (CDR) on a proliferated low-Earth orbit constellation of 16 missile tracking satellites for the Space Development Agency (SDA), clearing the way to begin production work on the space vehicles. The CDR maintained an accelerated pace and was completed within 13 months of the award announcement.

The satellites are part of the Tranche 1 Tracking Layer (T1TRK) that will identify and track hypersonic weapons and advanced missiles from the earliest stages of launch through interception.

Once in orbit, the satellites will operate in two of four low-Earth orbital planes, interconnected with Tranche 1 Transport Layer (T1TL) – another element of SDA's Proliferated Warfighter Space Architecture (PWSA), designed as a high-speed, high-volume data transport network connecting U.S. forces around the globe.

Candace Givens, vice president, overhead persistent infrared and geospatial systems, Northrop Grumman: "We are developing a more responsive, flexible and resilient space architecture to counter sophisticated threats. By passing this critical milestone on an accelerated timeline, we are closer to delivering critical missile defense and tracking technologies."

Fourteen of the satellites for T1TRK will feature a wide field-of-view sensor, three optical communications terminals and a Ka-band payload for communications. Two satellites will feature a medium field-of-view infrared sensor to demonstrate a fire-control solution.

Northrop Grumman is providing both space vehicles and ground systems for SDA's PWSA, a next-generation constellation in low-Earth orbit. To date, SDA has awarded Northrop Grumman contracts for 132 satellites.





The next NNG will be mailed in March.
