Annual Enrollment for Benefit Services is in Process

Northrop Grumman's Retiree Annual Enrollment for Benefit Services has been taking place from November 5 through November 19. Enrollment kits were sent the week of October 29. For those retirees choosing to stay with their 2007 selection of benefits, no action is needed. If you have not received your Enrollment package yet, call the Northrop Grumman Benefits Center (NGBC) at once.

As of January 1, 2008, Northrop Grumman will transition to a new benefits administrator. As a result, the enrollment worksheets look very different. The total cost of the health plan will be shown on the annual enrollment worksheet for the first time. Your Defined Dollar Benefit

(DDB) will now be noted as a "credit."

Northrop Grumman will continue to use the same phone number for the NGBC under new the benefits administrator. Benefits service representatives are available to assist you Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Eastern time, excluding holidays. If you are hearing impaired, you will need to use a relay servicethrough your TTY/TDD service provider.

Paying for your Retiree Medical Coverage in 2008

If you pay for your coverage on a monthly basis, you will receive a billing statement each month in advance. An annual supply of payment coupons will no longer be available in 2008. Your January 2008 billing statement will be mailed on December 13, 2007.

New for 2008!

If you are currently receiving a monthly bill for your benefits, you will soon be able to elect the convenience of having your cost automatically deducted from your personal checking or savings account. If you would like to have this electronic transfer happen automatically each month, call the NGBC and request a Direct Debit Authorization Form. (Note: This service is not available for your January payment.)

Electronic Transfer of Pension Checks Advised

Do you have your pension check delivered by the Post Office to your home? During the San Diego fires, delivery of some pension checks were held up because certain post offices were closed. If those retirees had direct deposit, they would have received their pension timely and avoided a trip to the bank. HAPPENINGS AT NORTHROP GRUMMAN Reported by Frank Warren

Electronic Systems Sector (NGES)

NORWALK, CN — The U.S. Air Force's Warner Robins Air Logistics Center has awarded NGES two contracts to provide radars and logistical support for the Air National Guard. The Northrop Grumman AN/APN-241 navigation and weather radars fulfill important mission requirements and also enhance the flying safety for Air National Guard C-130H and C-130J tactical airlift aircraft. The contract value for the radar systems is \$13.5 million, while the contract for continued logistical support is worth \$6.6 million.

Information Technology Sector (NGIT)

McLEAN, VA, — NGIT has been awarded a follow-on contract to provide operations support, resources and materials to the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders (FASD) Center for Excellence. The center aims to educate women and communities on the prevention of alcohol-related birth defects, and to improve the quality of life among individuals with a FASD. The contract is valued at \$47.9 million to NGIT. Work on the contract will be conducted over one year with four, one-year options in Rockville, MD.

Space Technology Sector (NGST)

REDONDO BEACH, CA — NASA's NGST-built James Webb Space Telescope (JWST) will use a new advanced technology network interface called SpaceWire that enables the components on the telescope to work together more efficiently and more reliably. SpaceWire is a standard for high-speed communication links between satellite components. Originally developed by the European Space Agency, SpaceWire has been adopted and improved by a team at the NASA Goddard Space Flight Center in Greenbelt, Md. The JWST Integrated Science Instrument Module and Command and Data Handling engineering team has developed a small and very low power microchip that sends and receives SpaceWire signals at speeds of over 200 megabits per second.

Integrated Systems Sector (NGIS)

PALMDALE, CA — NGIS completed the first center fuselage duct for the first weight-optimized Air Force F-35 Lightning II aircraft -- a conventional take-off and landing (CTOL) variant designated AF-1. The ducts are being produced at NG's composites manufacturing center in El Segundo, Calif. The company celebrated the AF-1 production milestone with a ceremony at its F-35 assembly facility in Palmdale, Calif. To date, the company has delivered center fuselages for six F-35 aircraft. The F-35 Lightning II is a stealthy, supersonic multi-role fighter designed to replace a wide range of aging fighter and strike aircraft.

Mission Systems Sector (NGMS)

HUNTSVILLE, AL — NGMS successfully demonstrated several new air and missile defense battle management tools last month during a 10-day U.S. Army exercise focusing on net-centric upgrades to the Patriot missile communications system. NGMS participated in the exercise, staged between Army command center elements at White Sands Missile Range, NM, and Ft. Bliss, TX. NGMS engineers used tactical radios, in addition to satellite communications, as the primary means of communicating between different echelons of the air and missile defense battle command structure. The company successfully demonstrated that advanced battle command capabilities such as real-time collaborative planning could be achieved with available tactical radios.
