- REDONDO BEACH, CA NGAS announced on September 19 that it had accepted buyouts from about 590 employees. This buyout, which began in July, is a voluntary program that offered employees a severance package consisting of a payout and medical insurance benefits that are tied to length of company service. The announcement stated that the majority of those accepting the buyout will leave by the end of September. Most of the jobs affected are in Redondo Beach, El Segundo, and Palmdale.

ated by NGAS' Linnie Haynesworth, vice president of aerospace products, included Lt. Gen. Ellen Pawlikowski, commander of the Space and Missile Systems Center (SMC) at Los Angeles Air Force Base; Wanda Austin, chief executive officer of The Aerospace Corp; Gwynne Shotwell, president of Space Exploration Technologies (SpaceX); and Betty Sapp, director of the National Reconnaissance Office. The panelists fielded questions from some of the more than 300 Northrop Grumman employees and Women in Aerospace supporters who attended the Aug. 21 event at the company's Space Park campus in Redondo Beach, Calif.

REDONDO BEACH, CA - NGAS has demonstrated an 850 gigahertz (GHz) integrated receiver that brings the company much closer to being the first to reach a Department of Defense frequency rate to 850 GHz, or 0.85 trillion cycles per second, under Phase 2 of the Defense Advanced Research Project Agency's (DARPA's) Terahertz Electronics program, setting a new performance record. Under Phase 1, they developed a Terahertz Monolithic Integrated Circuit that operated at 670 GHz, or 0.67 trillion cycles per second, in 2010. The goal of DARPA's Terahertz Electronics program is to develop the critical device and integration technologies necessary to realize compact, high-performance electronic circuits that operate at center frequencies exceeding 1.0 THz. The program focuses on two areas: THz high-power amplifier modules and THz transistor electronics.

REDONDO BEACH, CA — The two Space Tracking and Surveillance System (STSS) demonstration satellites aren't just for missile defense any more. As they chalked up 1,000 days on orbit as of June 21, the U.S. Missile Defense Agency (MDA) announced that STSS-D is tasked to fully leverage its unique sensor capabilities to collect data across the broad range of missions to include tracking of space launches, on-orbit satellites, satellite re-entries, and collecting of scientific background and scene data on space and terrestrial environments. "The two satellites, each with infrared sensor payloads, are able to take on new missions that leverage their unique sensor capabilities due to improvements in mission planning, spacecraft and payload software, ground automation and power management that have allowed a dramatic increase in data collection workloads," MDA said.

Electronics Systems Sector (NGES)

WOODLAND HILLS, CA. — The Navigation Systems Division of NGES supplied the navigation and pointing aid for NASA's Curiosity Mars rover, which recently began a historic two-year exploration of Mars. The LN-200S is a lightweight, fiber-optic inertial measurement unit (IMU). It is a critical navigational element that senses acceleration and angular motion, providing data outputs used by vehicle control systems for guidance. Additionally, the LN-200S helps position the rover's antennae to relay photos and data to satellites. The Curiosity Mars rover carries the most advanced payload of scientific gear ever used on the surface of Mars. The rover is capable of traveling up to 660 feet per day and rolling over obstacles up to 25 inches high. Unlike earlier rovers, Curiosity is equipped to gather, process, and distribute rock and soil samples to onboard test chambers.
