HAPPENINGS AT NORTHROP GRUMMAN

Aerospace Systems Sector (NGAS)

- ➤ PACIFIC MISSILE RANGE FACILITY, Hawaii The Space Tracking and Surveillance System (STSS) demonstration satellites, built by a NGAS and Raytheon team for the U.S. Missile Defense Agency, collected data during an Aegis Ballistic Missile Defense test June 26. It will be used to create a concept of operations for future space-borne, operational missile defense sensors.
- SAN DIEGO NGAS and the U.S. Navy added a second Triton unmanned aircraft to ground testing efforts in late September, part of an initial step in preparation for flight operations. Two Triton unmanned



for flight operations. Two Triton unmanned aircraft systems are being used to flight test and mature the system for operational use. The first Triton entered ground testing in July after production concluded in June. In 2008, the company was awarded a systems development and demonstration contract to build two aircraft

and test them in preparation for operational missions. The Navy's program calls for 68 Tritons to be built by late 2015.

▶ PATUXENT RIVER, Md. — NGAS and the U.S. Navy have conducted the Navy's first catapult launch of an unmanned system using the X-47B Unmanned Combat Air System (UCAS) demonstrator. The test was conducted at a shore-based catapult facility at Naval Air Station Patuxent River, Md. It marks the first of several shore-based catapult-to-flight tests that will be performed before the Navy's UCAS Carrier Demonstration (UCAS-D) program catapult launches the X-47B from a ship. In 2013, the program plans to demonstrate the ability of an X-47B to operate from a Navy aircraft carrier, including launch, recovery and air traffic control operations.

A Legacy of TRW's Lunar Module Descent Engine

Each November for almost twenty years retirees and NGC alumni of the historic Applied Technology Division of TRW have attended a luncheon in the South Bay area. At these luncheons, the spirit of ATD lives on as members (now becoming fewer and showing signs of seniority) recall the many programs and successes of the past such as Apollo, Viking, Propulsion Systems for all of TRW's pioneering scientific and military spacecraft, development of almost all of the nation's high-power chemical lasers and an incredibly broad spectrum of cutting edge science, technology and science payloads. Those programs and technologies still form the basis of many of NGC's development programs.

Last year at the luncheon on November 5th, 2012, Jerry Elverum, retired Vice President and General Manager of ATD (1980-1990), provided interesting information about the heritage passed on from ATD's Lunar Module Descent Engine (LMDE) to the booster and upper stage rocket engines used in *SpaceX's* highly successful new commercial launch vehicles. The LMDE utilized a propellant injection system concept that was unique among all other rocket engine injectors. It consisted of a single pintle element located in the center of the injector face. In addition to making it possible to throttle the engine using a single moving sleeve, the central location provided complete dynamic stability against the devastating combustion instabilities that plagued all other large liquid propellant rocket engines.

The scalability and stability of the central single pintle injector geometry was demonstrated over many years by TRW at thrust levels from 5,000 to more than 600,000 pounds of thrust utilizing many different propellant combinations. (Recall the "BIG DUMB BOOSTER" projects.) Therefore, when SpaceX was first formed about ten years ago with a goal of getting into the commercial launch vehicle business, they looked for a scalable low-cost rocket engine concept that would assure reasonable performance and no destructive combustion instabilities. They hired a young ATD rocket engineer named Tom Mueller and a couple of other ATD engineers who had worked on pintle injector engines to develop such a rocket engine. They incorporated simple gas-generator driven pumps to permit operation at chamber pressures much higher than the pressure-fed LMDE. That selection was proven to be totally successful. Tom Mueller is currently Vice President of Propulsion at SpaceX.

The single sleeve variable thrust technology of the LMDE is also used at *SpaceX* for their new Super Draco throttling engine for the man-rated version of their Dragon Payload Capsule. Thus, the spirit of ATD propulsion will live on in today's and future *SpaceX* launch vehicles and manned capsule applications.












































A Silver Anniversary! TRA is 25 Reported by Budd Cohen

Wow! Can it be 25 years since our Retirees Association was formed? Perhaps this is the best example of "Time flies when you're having fun."

Beginnings

In 1988 TRW encouraged us and helped us to start our "club." They even printed mailing labels for us to send invitations to all retirees to join us. Our gratitude still goes out to Jeff Wilkens, Sector Vice President of Human Resources, Don Jacobs, Deputy Sector General Manager for Internal Operations, and Jean George, our original TRW Advisor, for subsidizing our initial budget and making many helpful suggestions, such as registering our organization with the State of California as a separate and independent corporation.

Founders

Our initial motivators (Founders) were a group of recent retirees who conceived the idea of a group which would share memories, keep in touch with other ex-colleagues and friends, meet once in a while, share advice on issues of importance, and have fun doing these things. They were: Bob Crowe, Dick Luebben, George Lee, and TRW advisor M. Jean George. The founding steering committee included Ethel Curtis, Merle Darling, Jim Holland, Jeanne Lucke, Herb Rosen, Gladys Skinner, Chet Stevenson, Joe Twitchell, and Jack Whalen.

Obviously, their ideas clicked, as history shows, and we are forever grateful to them for that. They chose a Chairman, who was soon elected as the first president of TRA, namely, Bob Crowe. It is great that several of them are still with us after 25 years! We miss the others, especially Bob. Because of his experience with human relations, and his great personality and cheerfulness, he kept us going in difficult times and smoothed out the bumps in the road. I think it's fair to say that without his help we would have foundered.

Membership

We grew like Topsy. Within three years we had about 1700 members, and in five years, over 2600! TRW provided our mailing list at the start, which included all TRW retirees. It wasn't until August of 1993 that out mailing list included only paid members in TRA. Our membership topped out at 3960 members in 2000, just under our goal of 4000. Since then, Father Time has taken over, and at this writing we have about 2300 members including about 700 who are living outside the Greater Los Angeles area. We now have about a dozen "Chapters" located in many geographic areas outside of Space Park, including 35 States and three foreign countries.

Structure and Finances

Our original dues were \$5 per year and after two increases in 25 years they now stand at \$10. Not bad, only an average growth rate of 2.8%! And membership brings with it a subscription to our newsletter, and three social functions, one free to members and two subsidized by TRA.

Our current acronym, TRA, originally stood for *TRW Retirees Association*; but after TRW was acquired by Northrop

Grumman Corporation we wanted to keep the same acronym, so in 2003 we changed our name to *The Retirees Association*. Our logo was created



initially by Al Hausrath in 1993, and modified to the current logo in 2003.

We are governed by four officers: President, Vice President, Treasurer, and Secretary; and a Board of nine Directors, including the Immediate Past President to help provide stability and continuity. Our current president is Darrell Ausherman.

NG Curtails Space Park Retirees' Fitness Program

Aviation High School in Redondo Beach was adjacent to the TRW Space Park facility. When the High School was closed in 1982, the city turned the athletic facilities and the auditorium into Aviation Park. The athletic facilities there include a lighted track and field, a large gym, a small gym, a dance room, locker rooms, and restrooms. NG has leased three exercise rooms from the city and utilizes it for their employee and retiree fitness programs.

As of January 1, 2013, retirees and family members of active employees will no longer have access to the NGAS gym. All affected by these cancellations will be given a refund for the unused portion of their memberships.

TRA believes this is an extremely short-sighted policy that shows NGAS's lack of concern for its former employees, especially with regard to retiree health issues. Many responsible corporations are trying to control medical costs by encouraging health wellness practices among the people that they insure. The amount of money saved by this policy is inconsequential compared to the loss of good will among present and past employees.
