HAPPENINGS AT NORTHROP GRUMMAN

Aerospace Systems Sector (NGAS)

SAN DIEGO -- NGAS turned on the power to the U.S. Navy's first MQ-8C Fire Scout unmanned helicopter and rotated the aircraft's four blades for the first time during initial ground testing and engine runs at Naval Base Ventura County Point Mugu, Calif., Sept. 20. Conducting



initial engine runs of the aircraft allows engineers to collect data to ensure that all the aircraft's systems are functioning and communicating properly prior to its first flight. This latest aircraft upgrade to the Fire Scout system provides the Navy with more than twice the endurance and three times the payload carrying capacity, enabling an unprecedented level of persistent

surveillance, intelligence and reconnaissance capability. NGAS is the Navy's prime contractor for the Fire Scout program and is currently under contract to produce MQ-8C aircraft for deployment beginning in 2014.

OTTOBRUNN, GERMANY — Astrium, a subsidiary of the European Aeronautic Defence and Space Company, has completed the build of the Near-Infrared spectrometer (NirSpec), one of four instruments that will go in the NGAS James Web Space Telescope (JWST). NirSpec's job will be to determine the age, composition, movement and distance of the objects in its field of view. In a short ceremony in Ottobrunn on Friday, the instrument was handed over to the European Space Agency which had commissioned NirSpec. The Paris-based organization then immediately passed the near-\$300M instrument to NASA, which leads the JWST venture. The expectation is that some of these targets will include the very first stars to shine in the Universe. That would mean picking up light signals that have traveled across space for perhaps 13.6 billion light-years - something Hubble cannot do.

Information Systems Sector (NGIS)

FORT BENNING, GA – NGIS was selected to demonstrate its Carry-all Modular Equipment Landrover, called CaMEL, during the U.S. Army Maneuver Center of Excellence Robotics Limited Demonstration. CaMEL is a mid-sized unmanned ground vehicle (UGV) designed to accommodate multiple missions, including lightening the load; performing casualty evacuations; clearing antipersonnel mine routes; and hauling ammunition for dismounted mortar platoons. It can carry a load of 1,000 lbs. of equipment at a maximum speed of 5 miles per hour across rough terrain. CaMEL's hybrid design - diesel engine combined with a battery - not only provides more than 20 hours of continuous operations on 3.5 gallons of fuel but also produces power that can be exported and used for charging batteries or powering other systems. NGIS has sold more than 60 of its standard CaMEL UGVs to the Israeli military. The Army's Maneuver Center of Excellence at Fort Benning expressed an interest in it.

AEROSPACE: The industry that built the South Bay

So reads the headline on an interesting history of the Aerospace industry in Southern California. It was written by Rachel Reeves, a reporter for the Easy Reader Newspaper, a weekly publication serving the South Bay cities in Los Angeles County, and published in the October 17, 2013 edition of the newspaper.

Reeves traces the ups and downs of both the industry and its great effects on the South Bay communities. TRW and Northrop Grumman play an important part in this history. This is the first in a series of aerospace articles. Reeve's next article in the Easy Reader will be a report on the current status of the industry and the efforts to resuscitate it. Northrop Grumman Benefits Enrollment for 2014

The Northrop Grumman Benefit Center (NGBC) mailed both the 2014 Retiree Enrollment Benefits Guide and the personalized Health and Welfare Enrollment Worksheet in mid October. Did you receive yours? If not, it is possible NGBC does not have your current address. Your Health and Welfare Enrollment Worksheet not only shows your monthly rates for 2014 for the same coverage as you have in 2013, but lists the other options available to retirees.

If you plan to keep your current coverage, you do not need to enroll at this time. If you want to change your coverage, you must enroll between October 28 and November 10, 2013.

Proud Bird Restaurant to Close
