## JPL Tour March 27, 2014

TRA is very excited to offer a tour of the Jet Propulsion Laboratory facilities in Pasadena on Thursday, March 27, 2014! The tour will allow the visitor to see many of the fascinating JPL projects up close. Some of you have worked with JPL on past projects and will be especially enthusiastic to see the current ones — like the moon landing.

Buses will depart from Wilson Park, 2200 Crenshaw Blvd., Torrance at 10:00 a.m. and return at 5:00 p.m. Prior to the JPL tour we will have lunch at McCormick & Schmick's fine restaurant in Pasadena.

The JPL tour lasts between 2-2½ hours. The walking distance for the tour is approximately 0.8 miles with multiple flights of stairs. There is no handicapped access so unless you are able to walk a mile and climb stairs, please do not commit to attending the tour. We apologize for the restrictions, but they are JPL's and not TRA's. Since JPL runs background checks on all visitors, your reservation(s) will need to be received by TRA by February 23, 2014. Any guest not on the finalized roster by this date will not be allowed entry.

This tour is being offered to the first 80 NG/TRW retirees, family, and friends whose information and checks are received by Sunday, February 23, 2014. You must complete the form on Page 8. JPL requires your first and last name as well as your middle initial and your citizenship. All attendees must be 18 or older (no children allowed on this tour). # HAPPENINGS AT NORTHROP GRUMMAN

## **Northrop Grumman Corp. (NG)**

FALLS CHURCH, VA: — NG has honored 32 suppliers for their outstanding performance in support of its Socio-Economic Business Programs (SEBP). This is the 23rd year that NG has recognized its suppliers with World Class Team awards for



supporting the SEBP program, which strives to ensure that capable small businesses, including small disadvantaged, woman-owned, veteran-owned and service-disabled veteran-owned, historically underutilized business zones, AbilityOne organizations, lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender concerns and Historically Black Colleges/Universities and Minority Institutions, receive the maximum practicable subcontracting opportunities on all major programs. The extensive review of suppliers began last summer with awards given to companies demonstrating exceptional support and commitment to the SEBP goals and objectives using criteria such as product, service, quality and record. Other considerations included demonstrated delivery performance, outstanding program support, superior technical achievement, and reported cost performance/competitiveness and/or continuous process improvement.

## **Aerospace Systems Sector (NGAS)**

- ▶ MOJAVE, CA In one year, NGAS took a satellite communications system normally used in space and transformed it into a high-functioning, low-cost communications system that can be used on aircraft. The satellite communications (SATCOM) system was successfully demonstrated on board the company's Firebird demonstrator aircraft. Until now, no small communications system has been able to send sensor data to a satellite and back to a ground station at such a high rate of transfer. During the demonstration, the SATCOM system rapidly provided full-motion video to the ground. For demo purposes, the system and associated test equipment were housed within a pylon-mounted structure attached to the top of the Firebird fuselage. NGAS developed the SATCOM system using Gallium Nitride (GaN) technology, which first gained attention as the source of brightly colored LED lights. GaN allows for high communications output while using very little physical space.
- ➤ ANKARA, TURKEY: Turkish Aerospace Industries, Inc. (TAI), a subcontractor to NGAS, delivered its first F-35 Lightning II center fuselage to NGAS and Lockheed Martin at a ceremony held at TAI's facilities on Dec. 11, 2013. This is the first F-35 center fuselage manufactured by TAI as an international manufacturing partner to NGAS. The center fuselage will be installed into a U. S. Air Force aircraft at Lockheed Martin's facilities in Fort Worth, Texas. Turkish Aerospace Industries, Inc. (TAI), ranking among the top hundred global players in aerospace arena, is Turkey's center of technology in design, development, modernization, manufacturing, integration and life cycle support of integrated aerospace systems, from fixed and rotary wing air platforms to unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) systems and space systems. A total of 4,600 experienced personnel work at TAI of which 1,600 are engineers.

## **Electronic Systems Sector (NGES)**

▶ BALTIMORE – NGCobham Intercoms LLC, (NGCI) a joint venture between NGES and Cobham PLC, has been awarded the first production delivery order of the AN/VIC-5 enhanced vehicular communication system. The announcement was made during a ceremony at Aberdeen Proving Grounds, Aberdeen, Md., on Sept. 27. The U.S. Army PEO Enterprise Information Systems hosted the event to celebrate the decision for material release of the AN/VIC-5. This first production delivery order marks the official beginning of the program's production and deployment phase. AN/VIC-5 is an integrated intercom system that supports internet protocol communications to soldiers on the battlefield. It is the successor to AN/VIC-3, which has been proven in Iraq and Afghanistan on more than 100,000 U.S. ground vehicles. NGCI holds a \$2.4 billion indefinite delivery, indefinite quantity contract with the Army, awarded in 2009, for delivery of the system, which completed rigorous validation and verification testing earlier this year.



















































# TRW Technology Major Firsts One More

In the August, 2013, issue of the NNG we posted an article from an unknown source that listed 39 TRW technology firsts from 1903 to 1997. Now we have a 40th technology first for this impressive list: Water injection into large rocket launches to reduce the plume induced pressure and heating environment. (1961)

While the water injection scheme was a very intuitive thing to do, Gene Briadwell and C. N. Tsu performed theoretical analysis which correlated well with test results.
