If you know of a deceased retiree that should be included in the "In Memoriam" column in future NNGs, please inform us by either mail or email to the TRA office. As a minimum, we need the name of the deceased; date of death; and the name of the person submitting the information. If more information is available and desired, include age, position and years at NG/TRW, any notable programs, and special skills.

# HAPPENINGS AT NORTHROP GRUMMAN

#### **Aerospace Systems Sector (NGAS)**

▶ PALMDALE, CA — NGAS has delivered the center fuse-



lage for Japan's first F-35 Joint Strike Fighter, an F-35A conventional takeoff and landing (CTOL) aircraft designated AX-1. As a principal member of the Lockheed Martin-led F-35 industry team, NGAS designed and produces the center fuselage for all three F-35 variants: the F-35A; the F-35B short takeoff vertical landing variant; and the F-35C carrier varian. It is the 206th center fuselage that the com-

pany has produced at its Palmdale Aircraft Integration Center of Excellence, and the 44th such unit delivered this year.

- ► REDONDO BEACH, CA NGAS reached another major milestone for NASA's James Webb Space Telescope, with the delivery of the Deployable Tower Assembly (DTA). Following successful ambient and thermal vacuum testing, the DTA was delivered to the Space Park facility, where the Webb Telescope is being assembled. The graphite DTA was designed, built and tested by NGAS's Astro Aerospace. NASA's James Webb Space Telescope is made up of four major components — the telescope, the integrated science instrument module, the sunshield, and the spacecraft. The DTA interfaces and supports the spacecraft and the telescope structures, and serves two key functions on Webb. In the stowed configuration, the DTA allows the telescope and instruments to fit into the rocket fairing with an acceptable center of gravity for launch. Second, in the deployed configuration, it will lift the telescope mirrors and instruments away from the heat of the main spacecraft. This allows the sunshield to unfurl, reducing the amount of radiant heat the instruments are exposed to on orbit.
- ➤ CARPINTERIA, CA The NASA Jet Propulsion Laboratory successfully deployed the mesh reflector and boom aboard the Soil Moisture Active Passive (SMAP) spacecraft, a key milestone on its mission to provide global measurements of soil moisture. SMAP represents the future of Earth Science by helping researchers better understand our planet. SMAP's unmatched data capabilities are enabled in part by the largest spinning mesh reflector ever deployed in space, designed and built by Astro Aerospace, an NGAS company. The reflector and boom are a critical system for SMAP, allowing the observatory to measure soil moisture levels around the world every two to three days. SMAP is the first application of Astro Aerospace's new AstroMesh-Lite(R) reflector. This ultralight and extremely stiff reflector is ideally suited for high frequency communications and radar applications.

- Although the requirements of the mission are complex, the SMAP reflector weighs only 56 pounds.
- PALMDALE, CA—NGAS and members of NATO's Alliance Ground Surveillance Management Agency (NAGSMA) celebrated an important and much anticipated milestone. Leaving from Palmdale, NATO's first Alliance Ground Surveillance (AGS) aircraft successfully executed a comprehensive range of test points before landing at Edwards Air Force Base. A derivative of the wide-area surveillance Global Hawk, the unmanned aircraft has the ability to fly for up to 30 hours at a time.

#### **Information Systems Sector (NGIS)**

➤ SAN DIEGO, CA — NGIS has named Jeannie Hilger as vice president of the Network Communication Systems business for NGIS. In this role, Hilger is responsible for programs including advanced military communications, airborne gateways, network architectures, and support systems that enable network-centric operations for defense and homeland security customers worldwide. She reports to Mike Twyman, sector vice president and general manager of the Defense Systems division of NGIS.

#### **Technical Services Sector (NGTS)**

HERNDON, VA — NGTS will demonstrate its latest advances in training solutions at the 2015 Interservice/ Industry Training, Simulation and Education Conference (I/ITSEC) at the Orange County Convention Center in Orlando, Florida. In support of the conference's theme this year, "Forging the Future Through Innovation," NGTS's exhibit will feature its capabilities in adaptive learning; distributed mission operations; on-demand live, virtual and constructive integrated range solutions; PC-based Open-architecture Re-configurable Training System (PORTS).
