Feb. 16, 2016 - The MQ-4C Triton unmanned aircraft system (UAS) built for the U.S. Navy by Northrop Grumman Corporation has successfully completed Operational Assessment (OA). Pending final data analysis, the completion of this milestone signals the maturity of the system and paves the way for a positive Milestone C decision. Milestone C will transition Triton into low rate initial production.

NG Board Declares Quarterly Dividend

Feb. 16, 2016 - The board of directors of NG declared a quarterly dividend of \$0.80 per share on NG common stock, payable March 16, 2016, to shareholders of record as of the close of business Feb. 29, 2016.

US Navy Selects Northrop Grumman to Design and Produce Shipboard Laser Weapon System Demonstrator

Dec. 22, 2015 - The U.S. Navy will get a peek at a future where high energy laser weapons could defend its ships against attack under a contract awarded Oct. 22 to Northrop Grumman Corporation by the Office of Naval Research (ONR).

Under the three-phase Laser Weapon System Demonstrator (LWSD) contract, the company will design, produce, integrate, and support the shipboard testing of a 150-kilowatt-class solid state (electric) laser weapon system. •••

They will help to keep your body cute.


Chicken, turkey, salad, and fish, Each will provide a tasty dish.
