Each summer the TRA Board nominates its Officers and Directors-at-Large for the coming year. These names are then submitted to the members to ratify or to nominate other candidates. Officers serve for a one-year term, while the Directors-at-Large are elected for a term of two years. The longer term for the latter group helps bring continuity to the management and operation of TRA. Directors-at-Large are limited to three consecutive terms (six years.) Officers are limited to two consecutive terms (two years), with the exception of the Treasurer, who may serve up to five consecutive terms.

As a minimum, we need the name of the deceased; date of death; and the name of the person submitting the information. If more information is available and desired, include age, position and years at NG/TRW, any notable programs, and special skills.

Simon Ramo, the "R" in TRW, died June 27th of natural causes in his sleep at his home in Santa Monica. He was 103. Ramo was born in Salt Lake City on May 7, 1913. Ramo earned a doctorate in electrical engineering and physics from Caltech at age 23. After World War II, Ramo moved to Hughes Aircraft Co. to launch a division devoted to military electronics. Ramo left Hughes in 1953 and formed the Ramo-Wooldridge Corporation to lead the development of the intercontinental ballistic missile.

In 1958, Ramo-Wooldridge merged with Thompson Products, and the company was eventually renamed TRW.

Ramo is survived by two children, Jim and Alan. His wife of 71 years, Virginia, died in 2009.

was president of the TRW/SEA square dance club, Pioneer 8's. Jack is a docent at the Los Angeles Maritime Museum as well as the Western Museum of Flight. He serves on the board of the Peninsula Symphony Association. Jack is a past president of TRA.

"Drawing on our history of successful manned and unmanned space programs, as well as our advanced communications technologies, we are excited to be working with JPL on the best design for a future Mars orbiter."
