
















ENGINEERING OUR WAY TO THE MOON

We received a note from Richard Boudreau regarding the last issue. He writes:

Just received my TRA Gazette for March/April 2019 and saw that Al Hausrath had passed. My condolences to all who were close to and worked with Al at TRA – I will miss him being here. Al and I were Department Managers under Paul Albro when in 1975 I transferred from Houston Operations to SEID in Redondo Beach.

In 2014, I took a "nostalgia trip" back to Houston, Texas and Huntsville, Alabama and Al published my recounting of that trip in TRA's May/June 2015 Gazette.

The trip was the genesis for a book I just published (March 2019) which can be found at Amazon.com by searching for "ENGINEERING OUR WAY TO THE MOON" or going direct to tinyurl.com/ApolloEngineer.

I would appreciate you mentioning my book in the next TRA Gazette. Given that this July will be the 50th anniversary of the first Apollo moon landing, my opinion is that it would be of considerable interest to many ex-TRW employees as well as those at NGC. There is much TRW stuff there - why and how Houston Operations was started, our many roles in and highlights of supporting the Apollo program, etc. The book's back cover text provides further indication of its contents:

ENGINEERING OUR WAY TO THE MOON

Untold Apollo Stories

A TRW engineer's untold story of an extensive two-year NASA activity that established how the many elements of the Apollo onboard and ground Guidance, Navigation & Control systems were to be used in flying to the moon. Called Apollo Mission Techniques, they provided a controlled GNC baseline used by the many individuals involved in hardware and software development, preflight planning, flight simulations and real-time flight operations.

The author's personal and family adventures back then are also included. Plus:

- · The Space Race for historical context. The Soviet programs, the American programs, our embarrassing early efforts, all described.
- · How Gemini problems led to TRW's early Mission Techniques effort for NASA before the tragic Apollo fire.
- · How Bill Tindall and his "Tindallgrams" continued that TRW activity to produce a trajectory control baseline for all moon landing flights.
- The Germans in Huntsville how Von Braun's team launched America's first satellite, then developed the Apollo booster rockets using new systems management methods and "all up" testing per Air Force ICBM programs.
- · How a TRW Vice President joined NASA and became the single individual most responsible for the success of the Apollo program.

TRW during this period was a leading aerospace company – best known for its development of high-technology satellites and its pioneering systems engineering/systems management work for the Air Force.
