#### The Proud Bird Restaurant Tuskegee Ballroom 11022 Aviation Blvd Los Angeles 90045 Friday, December 6, 2019, 11:00AM to 2:00PM

The elegant and beautifully remodeled Proud Bird has refurbished and updated their "Airplane Park," which features full-scale vintage aircraft models with views of the Los Angeles Airport landing approach. We will be in the Tuskegee Ballroom, which is located right next to the main restaurant entrance. Doors will open at 11:00AM so no need to show up early.

We have planned a sit-down, plated lunch. Your entree choices are: Cedar-Smoked Salmon in a habanero-orange beurre blanc sauce; or Bludso's Smoked Brisket, with BBQ sauce on the side. Entrees will be served with herb mashed potatoes, local organic seasonal vegetables, and Rockenwagner Bakery rolls and butter. For dessert, we'll have their most popular sweet - cheesecake with fresh berries.

integrated for the final time. This phase is scheduled to run through June 2020 and is followed by three months of shipping and launch preparation activities. Launch is currently scheduled for the end of November, 2021.

While waiting for the tour (we will shuffle subgroups to and from the viewing area,) we will have video playing in the E2 Presentation Center. Also, our visitors will get to enjoy the recently updated "Aerospace in Motion Museum" that is on the first floor of Building E2.

These free events are for TRA members and guests who are U.S. citizens. Sign-ups are available first-come, first-served, on our website at www.tra-spacepark.org. No mail-in or phone sign-ups will be accepted.

If you haven't registered for our website, there is a simple, onetime registration process available through the home page. Signups will close October 10th (or earlier if we fill up) for the October 15th tour so that we can forward the tour attendee list to Northrop and get visitor badges printed. The October 30th tour will close on October 25th (or earlier if we fill up.)

Note that the Building S Cafeteria is open for lunch from 11:00 AM until 1:00 PM, so you could consider meeting up with friends and have lunch at the cafeteria before/after the tour.

Upon your sign-up and notification that you have been accepted for the tour, please plan to meet in the Space Park Building E2 lobby 20 minutes before the start of the tour to be signed in. Parking space is currently tight around Building E2. The North side of the parking lot between Building R3 and Building E2 seems to have the most space available.

You will need to bring a valid form of government-issued identification, such as a state driver's license or U.S. passport.

As part of the tour, we will be walking between buildings and going up and down stairs. No cameras or photography is allowed.
