## HAPPENINGS AT NORTHROP GRUMMAN

### Northrop Grumman Announces Realigned Operating Sectors

Northrop Grumman Corp. will function under realigned operating sectors beginning at the first of the year. Starting Jan. 1, Northrop Grumman will have four operating sectors: Aeronautics Systems, Defense Systems, Mission Systems and Space Systems.

"This new operating structure allows us to take full advantage of our company's portfolio by aligning businesses that have shared markets, customers and technologies," said Kathy Warden, chair, CEO and president of Northrop Grumman. "It will accelerate our ability to rapidly identify and deliver the technologies, products and services our customers need, and fuel our continued growth and execution."

Janis Pamiljans, current corporate vice president and president of Aerospace Systems, will lead the Aeronautics Systems sector, which is responsible for engineering and manufacturing manned and unmanned air systems.

Mary Petryszyn, current vice president and general manager, Land and Avionics C4ISR, Mission Systems, will lead Defense Systems, which provides critical technology services, sustainment and modernization, including integrated battle command systems, directed energy, tactical weapons and information systems.

Mission Systems, which focuses on open, cybersecure, software-defined systems for defense and intelligence applications across multiple domains, will be led by Mark Caylor, current corporate vice president and president of Mission Systems.

Blake Larson, current corporate vice president and president of Innovation Systems, will lead the Space Systems sector. That sector provides space and launch systems serving national security, civil and commercial customers.

**Jan Newsham**, 84, August 20, 2019. Jan worked in Security at TRW/NG.


**Richard Flores Ramirez**, 79, August 31, 2019. He worked for TRW/NG for over 35 years.
