We hope to see you there!


## 2019 TRA Expenses

#### **50th Anniversary of Apollo 13**

How many of you supported the heroic effort to bring back to earth the crew of Apollo 13?

April 2020 marks the 50th anniversary of the flight of Apollo 13 on its journey to the moon. As the mission approached the moon, with a docked lunar module (LM) and command service module (CSM), the crew performed a routine operation to monitor the oxygen level. After the crew threw a switch they heard a big bang. The switch had energized a short in the electrical system causing an explosion in one of the two CSM oxygen tanks and damaging the other. Communication with the ground crew recorded the now-famous line, "Houston, we've had a problem."

As a result of the explosion the flight crew and ground controllers faced a critical problem - how to get the crew safely back to earth. The CSM was losing power and life sustaining systems. The CSM had no source of electricity or water. A decision was made to isolate the reserve re-entry oxygen tank, power down the CSM, and use the LM as a lifeboat.

Since they were not in a "free return" trajectory they would miss the earth by thousands of km. Consequently, a course correction was needed and the LM descent engine was the only option since the CSM engine also may have been damaged. An immediate recalculation of the time to initiate the engine burn and length of burn time to fire was required.

Since there was no power to the navigation system the Apollo crew used the sun, stars and earth terminator for orientation and a stop watch to time the engine firing sequence.

With a buildup of fatal carbon dioxide in the smaller LM compartment, the crew fabricated an adapter in the LM to use the purification capsules from the CSM, using plastic manual covers and duct tape.

After nearly 143 hours in the mission Apollo 13 successfully landed in the Pacific Ocean, avoiding a disaster.

For the Apollo program TRW provided the LM descent engine, software for mission analysis and simulation, guidance and trajectory control, abort guidance control and a backup communications system. At the time, TRW had an ad highlighting the LM descent engine whose tagline was "The last 10 miles are on us." After the successful performance of the LM descent engine, TRW modified the billboard and magazine ads to read "The last 300,000 miles are on us".


